# **Absestos injuries:**

#### Mesothelioma

Mesothelioma is a rare cancer that is becoming increasingly common. Its main cause is exposure to asbestos and it most frequently starts in the lining of the lungs but can also start in the abdomen. In its early stages mesothelioma does not have many symptoms, these begin once the cancer has grown and presses on a nerve or body organ. Common symptoms include chest pain, shortness of breath, tiredness, weight loss and a persistent cough. Surgery, radiotherapy and chemotherapy can help to alleviate symptoms and research is continuing to improve prognosis.

#### Lung cancer

Although both affecting the lungs, pleural mesothelioma and lung cancer are separate cancers which can be caused by asbestos exposure. Lung cancer originates in the lung tissue, as opposed to pleural mesothelioma which originates in the lung's outer lining. Symptoms are similar and include shortness of breath, chest pain, fatigue and weight loss. Surgery, chemotherapy and radiation therapy are used to treat lung cancer and patients generally have a better survival rate than those with mesothelioma.

#### **Asbestosis**

Asbestosis is a long-term lung condition caused by prolonged exposure to asbestos. Symptoms include shortness of breath, a persistent cough, fatigue and chest pain. There is no cure for asbestosis once it has developed and it can worsen over time, although in many cases the condition progresses very slowly or not at all. Those diagnosed with asbestosis however have a higher risk of developing pleural disease, mesothelioma and lung cancer.

#### Pleural disease (pleural thickening/fibrosis and plaques)

Asbestos pleural diseases are similar to asbestosis but occur in the pleura, the thick lining between the lungs and chest wall. Diffuse scarring along the chest wall is known as 'pleural thickening' or fibrosis, while more defined scarring is known as 'pleural plaques'. Pleural plaques normally exhibit no symptoms, but thickening can result in shortness of breath and impair the lungs' function.
